1. ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The variety of methods and approaches adopted in studying History is one of the major exercises that is being done in the teaching-learning process of History at Gautam Buddha University. The course structures of the two programmes being offered by the Department of History and Civilization are designed to prepare the students at par with History studies at the global level. The programmes nurture values related to overall well being of the students. They develop critical thinking and emotional stability of the student. The course are designed to make him aware of social justice and develop his skills for employability.

2. PROGRAMMES

The department is running two programmes, BA (Hons.) History and Civilization and MA History and Civilization. The MA programme is of two years duration and has four semesters of six months each. has three core courses in each semester which include course on the historiographical interventions and research methodology. The courses are designed chronologically and thematically. There are a wide range of options for the students in three elective courses in each of the semesters from first to the third. In the fourth semester there is only one elective course and the student has to write a dissertation instead of two more elective courses. In the first year global civilizations are taught, except in the generic categories where the courses offered are of interdisciplinary nature or history courses other than the theme of the semester. In the second year the student chooses the main stream he is going to specialise in. It can be either in Ancient, Medieval or Modern India.

The course structure of BA Honours follows the National Education Policy 2020. It thus aims to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded creative individuals. There are multiple exit points with flexible degree options in the four year BA Honours programme. The syllabi which was first prepared when the programme came in to being in 2019, has been revised three times since then. As it has developed over the years, it includes a wider and increased number of elective courses for the students to choose from.

3. BRIEF PROFILE OF THE FACULTY

Keeping NEP 2020 in mind the interdisciplinary nature of course structure is prepared and has the active participation of teachers from departments other than History. These include Dr. Gyanaditya Shakya, who specialises in Pali language and Buddhist studies is teaching courses on Buddhism at both post graduate and undergraduate levels. He is also teaching Pali language to the MA students.Dr. Vibhavari, who specialises in Cinema and Women, is teaching courses on Popular culture and Gender studies at undergraduate level and courses on Cinema and Gender studies at Post graduate level. Dr. Paswan specialises in Indian art and architecture and teaches courses on architecture and heritage of India. Dr. Diwakar Garwa is teaching Hindi as the ability enhancement course.
